### **Sensory-Friendly Halloween Tips**

Sensory issues affect, on average, 1 in 20 children in the United States. As we become more aware of sensory issues, businesses and organizations are offering sensory-friendly events. You can also help make Halloween more sensory friendly in your community with the following tips:

- $\Rightarrow$  Limit Sensory triggers such as fog machines, strobe lights, loud noises, and sound effects.
- $\Rightarrow$  Keep in mind that a child may have sensory issues with wearing a costume. Be accepting of their choices, even if that choice is not to wear a costume at all.
- $\Rightarrow$  Be sensitive to children experiencing sensory overload and understand there might be some unexpected behaviors.
